Course Objectives

By the end of course, you will be able to:

- Compare a variety of lessons and resources included in *Integrating Career Awareness into the ABE* & *ESOL Classroom (ICA) Curriculum Guide* to assist students completing a Career and Education Planning Worksheet.
- Complete a Lesson Planning Template from the *ICA Curriculum Guide* that is tailored to the student levels, intensity of instruction, length of your program cycle and aligned, where applicable, to your state or program content standards.
- Determine the preparation, classroom time, and resources that you will need in order to deliver the lessons that you've included in your Lesson Planning Template.
- Apply a framework for setting a personal goal and discuss how you would introduce this framework to students to help them set concrete goals.
